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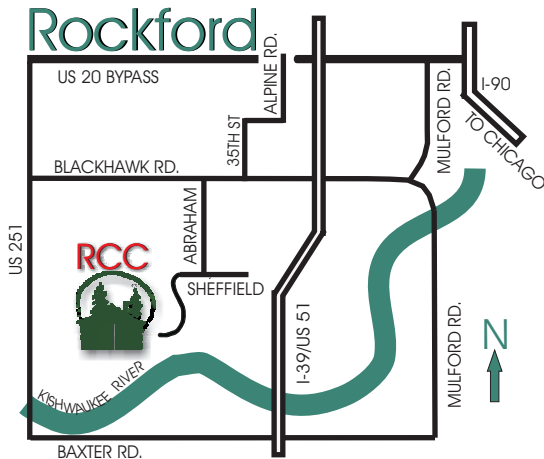
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Registration Times

Registration for summer sessions begins at 2:00 p.m. on Saturday. Registration for retreats begins at 4:00 p.m. on Friday. We cannot accept responsibility for campers left before registration times. Please help us provide safety and good supervision for our campers by respecting these times.

VISITATION TIMES have been established in order to prevent disruption of the camp program. Any other visits must have the prior consent of the session director. Visitors making special visits should check in with the camp director and are not to participate in activities unless invited by the director. Visitors eating meals should pay an appropriate charge. Established visitation times are Talent Night (see director) and the Closing Program at 10:00 am on Saturday.

DIRECTIONS TO RCC RCC is located in north-central Illinois, just south of the city of Rockford on the Kishwaukee River. It lies 2.3 miles east of US 251, and 2.4 miles south of US20 Bypass. FROM CHICAGO: Take I-90 west to US20 Bypass, Alpine Rd. Exit. Turn left (south); jog right to the stop sign. Turn left on 35th St. and go south to Blackhawk Rd. Right to Abraham, left to Sheffield, right to the camp entrance. FROM DOWNSTATE: I-39 north to Baxter, west to US 251, right (north) to Blackhawk, right to Abraham...



WHAT TO BRING

Mark All Possessions with Indelible Ink

- Bible, Notebook, pen/pencils, flashlight, extra batteries.
- Sleeping bag or blankets and sheets, pillow.
- Clothing for 8 days (shirts, pants, underwear, socks).
- Shoes for hiking and play.
- **OLD** shoes for river games.
- Jacket, sweatshirt, rain gear.
- Ball glove (marked), musical instruments needed for talent night.

RCC GENERAL RULES:

1. Every person must keep the schedule.
2. All campers will attend Bible classes, worship services, program activities, and recreation activities unless excused by the camp nurse or session director.
3. All campers must be in their beds after lights out.
4. Appropriate Dress will be no shorter than approximately knee-length. Jeans and slacks are recommended. No "undershirt" style-tank tops will be worn as outerwear, and no bare midriffs are allowed. Tops should be modest. Shoes must be worn at all times outside the cabins. For river activities, swimsuits will be worn under loose fitting old street clothes and old shoes.
5. Absolutely no tobacco, alcohol, or non-prescribed controlled substances is allowed
6. No one will leave the camp grounds, even with parents, without permission from the camp director.
7. Pets, weapons, radios (including cassettes, CD players, MP3, etc), televisions, cell-phones, pagers, laser pointers, and all kinds of fireworks are not permitted. These detract from the atmosphere we are trying to create at camp.
8. Destruction of property or wildlife is not permitted.
9. The directors reserve the right to send home any person who is having a detrimental effect on the camp session. No refunds will be made.
10. Boys are not allowed in the girls' area; girls are not allowed in the boys' area. Practical jokes and cabin raids are not allowed. Parents expect us to provide a safe and well-supervised atmosphere.
